



COLLEGE PROFILE

IMCG (PG) G-10/4 traces its origin to September 1990 when it was established to cater to the growing educational needs of the federal capital. ADMISSION POLICY

HSSC PART I, ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM (2 YEARS) &BS PROGRAM (4 YEARS) FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021 ONWARDS

Admission Policy will be applicable to all Islamabad Model Colleges functioning under the administrative jurisdiction of Federal Directorate of Education, Islamabad.

1. ACADEMIC SESSION

The academic session for Intermediate level (HSSC) and Bachelors level (BS/ADP) shall be determined by the announcement of results of SSC and HSSC by Federal Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education, Islamabad and/or as per schedule issued by Qauid-e-Azam University where applicable.

2. BASIC ELIGIBILITY

Candidates of the following categories will be eligible for admission against all seats:

- 1) Federal Government Employees residing in Islamabad/Rawalpindi.
- 2) Residents of Islamabad Capital Territory.
- 3) Diplomats stationed at Islamabad.

A candidate, who has passed the last examination from an institution not located in Islamabad Capital Territory shall produce residence certificate from Estate Office/CDA or any other valid legal document **(CNICs or Utility Bills indicating residential address of the parents)** in support of **their** claim pertaining to residence.

3. Admission to HSSC Part I, Associate Degree Program (two years) and Bachelor of Science BS(4 years) will be made on merit as per allocation of seats given below:

A) ADMISSION QUOTA

Admissions to BS Program and AD Program should be made in accordance with the admission policy of the Quaid I Azam University.

B) ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION IN BS & AD PROGRAMS

i. An individual holding a Higher Secondary School Certificate from a Pakistani Board of Examination or an equivalent certificate from any other recognized institution, with at least 50% marks, or its equivalent grade, is eligible for admission to the BS program.

ii. An individual holding a Higher Secondary School Certificate from a Pakistani Board or an equivalent certificate from any other recognized institution, with at least 45% marks or its equivalent grade, is eligible for admission to the AD program.

i) Age Limit

The maximum age limit for admission to the BS/AD program is 22 years. Any one beyond the age of 22 years shall not be given admission unless the relaxation is granted by the Vice- Chancellor Quaide-Azam University under special circumstances on the recommendations of the Principal concerned.

ii) In case a college offers multiple BS programs, the candidate will apply separately for each program if he/she so desires.

D) MERIT CRITERIA

The merit shall be calculated as per criteria mentioned here under: Matric/SSC/Equivalent: 30% FA/FSC/Equivalent: 70%

<u>Merit = (MOM)/(TM) x 30% + (MOF)/(TM) x 70%</u>

Where, MOM=Marks obtained in Matric or equivalent MOF=Marks obtained in F.Sc or equivalent TM=Total Marks in the relevant Examination

E) MERIT LIST

The lists of selected candidates will be displayed as per dates announced by FDE on the notice board as well as on the website of concerned college, if the facility is available. No call letters shall be sent to the selected candidates. Admission to one department shall not give a student a right to migrate to another department.

F) Equivalence Certificate

Candidates having foreign certificates should provide equivalence certificates and conversion of the grades into marks from Inter Board Committee for SSC and HSSC levels.

5. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Following general instructions will be strictly followed during the process of admission.

- a) A candidate domiciled in FATA/FANA will not contest a seat reserved against the allocated quota if she has qualified SSC/HSSC from any institution outside the tutorial jurisdiction of FATA/FANA. However, after admission process has been completed, in case there is any vacant seat under this category, admission may be granted to applicants with FATA/FANA Domicile. Such candidates will, however, have to arrange for their own accommodation in case Hostel facilities are not available in the respective college of admission.
- b) Top three position holders from any Examination Board of Pakistan will be eligible for admission for all levels i.e. **HSSC, BS, Associate Degree Program** in their respective disciplines, regardless of the basic eligibility criteria i.e. proof of residence. However, they will not be eligible for hostel accommodation.
- c) Students seeking admission on sports quota basis at Board Level will submit an authentic Merit Certificate issued from the relevant Board along with the application form. Merit within sports quota will be determined after addition of points obtained as per following criteria to the total marks obtained by the applicant in respective examination.

Note: If a student fails to prove his/her competence in the specific sport, his/her admission will be cancelled.

d) If any seat(s) against any quota are not fully utilized due to non-availability of eligible

candidates, the same will stand transferred to the Open Merit quota. However, proper documentation of transfer of each seat shall be made for verification initially by the Director concerned, to be finalized by the Director General.

- f) Admissions shall be made as per timeline and schedule issued by Federal Directorate of Education.
- g) Students placed in compartment in SSC/HSSC examination will compete for admission after clearing the subject(s) in the same year within the prescribed time limit fixed by Board/University subject to availability of seats in the institution or next year as a fresh candidate.
- h) Candidates who seek admission after a gap of one or more years may be considered for admission when applied. However, they will have to submit an affidavit of good conduct duly verified by head of the institution last attended. Reason of the gap should also be clearly stated in the affidavit. Merit of such candidates will be determined after deducting five marks for each year of the gap from the total marks obtained by them.
- i. The number of seats will be determined by the institution in each faculty after careful consideration of physical facilities and the number of teachers available. However, the number of admissions will be finalized by the Federal Directorate of Education in consultation with Hads of Institutions before the commencement of academic session.
- j) Students who have passed Senior Cambridge, GCE/O-Level/A-Level examination/Diploma from Polytechnic institutions will be eligible for admission along with other candidates. Their merit will be determined on the percentage of marks obtained in their respective examinations and equivalence shall be determined by Inter Board Committee of Chairmen, Islamabad / University concerned, whichever is applicable. A certificate to this effect is a pre-requisite for admission at the level concerned.
- k) All foreign national students are required to route their application for admission through the Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training.
- Migration (inter-city and inter-provisional) cases eligible for admission as per policy will be entertained by institution where seats are available provided that the merit in the desired discipline of the institution is not compromised. No local migration will be allowed. However, relaxation in rules may be permitted by the competent authority i.e. Director General, Federal Directorate of Education, Islamabad, keeping in view genuineness of hardship on case to case basis.
- m) Twenty (20) marks will be added in the merit of Hifz-e-Quran for admission at all levels, provided that the candidates produce a certificate of successful completion of the course from a registered/recognized Institution (Religious Boards)
- n) Notice for calling the applications for admission would be advertised by the Federal Directorate of Education, Islamabad and no college shall be allowed to advertise on its own.
- o) Every successful applicant will submit an affidavit on legal stamp paper addressed to the Principal solemnly assuring that she will refrain from participating in politics or in any

subversive activity during the time he/she is on the college rolls. His/her parent/guardian will endorse this undertaking, and further undertake that his/her ward would be liable for removal from the college rolls if she participates in politics or does not abide by the rules of the college.

- p) In case any person other than father/mother of the candidates is declared guardian, a proper legal affidavit/legal Guardian ship certificate will have to be submitted. Guardian ship of persons other than grandparents/real elder brother/sister and maternal/paternal uncles shall not be accepted.
- q) Students are expected to exercise their choice of subject carefully with due consideration. Change will not ordinarily be allowed to the choice once exercised. However, in case of extreme hardship cases change of subjects may be allowed within maximum of two weeks after commencement of classes. The change, of course, will be subject to the condition that a candidate admitted in group of lower merit does not opt for a group of higher merit.
- r) The last date for admission fixed by the Federal Directorate of Education, Islamabad shall be strictly adhered to. In case Principals are in need of filling the vacant seats after expiry of the stipulated admission date they will seek formal permission from the Federal Directorate of Education.
- s) Attendance criteria prescribed by the Federal Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education and Quaid-i-Azam University will be strictly adhered to. Principals will ensure that transparent, regular, unambiguous record of daily attendance is maintained at all times on accountable roll call registers.

SCHEME OF STUDIES

A. Medium of Instruction

Students may opt for English or Urdu as their medium of instruction in the faculty of Arts. However, the medium of instruction will be only English for the faculty of Science at Intermediate, Degree and Post Graduate levels.

B. HSSC (Humanities / Science)

HSSC Part-I and Part-II examinations are held by the Federal Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Islamabad at the end of each academic year. The certificate is however, awarded by the Board on the successful completion of the two year course. This course consists of three compulsory subjects and the three elective subjects as per the following scheme.

ELECTIVE SUBJECTS (SCIENCE)

Any one of the combinations from the following groups may be selected. Each subject carries 100 marks. The selection of subjects should be done very carefully as no change will be allowed after admission.

S-02	Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics (Pre-Engineering.)
S-03	Physics, Computer Science, Mathematics (General Science)
S-04	Physics, Statistics, Mathematics (General Science)

S-06	Mathematics, Statistics, Economics (General Science)

- Students passing their SSC Examination with Humanities Group shall not be eligible for admission in Science Group at HSSC level.
- The subject of Mathematics can only be offered to the students passing SSC with Science subjects by securing at least 60% marks.
- Sections once allocated at the time of admission will not be changed on any request.
- English literature will be allowed to those students only who qualify the aptitude test. This test will be held within a week after the commencement of the classes.
- If the number of students selecting a specific subject and subject combinations is less than 10, it will not be offered.
- In view of limited number of seats candidates may be asked to adjust their options according to the availability of seats in each combination.
- **Note:** As virtual academic culture sees an upsurge, our students need to be technologically furnished so that they may extract benefit from variant e- learning platforms.

FEE RULES

Payment of Fees

The academic year of the college for payment of fee starts from the month of July. Students are therefore required to pay their tuition fees and other dues from that date and according to the schedule notified from time to time.

The fee is collected annually at the commencement of the new session therefore students are advised to pay their dues on time.

Students are advised to deposit all dues to fee clerk after obtaining proper receipt. No other person is authorised to collect any fee. Parents/guardians must emphasise upon their daughters/wards to obtain fee receipts. Students should keep the receipts of fee paid, on person and produce them on demand.

- Half fee concession may be granted on request to deserving students of the college subject to the availability of funds.
- If two or more sisters are studying in the college, the youngest one will be granted half fee concession on submission of necessary proof of her claim provided no other financial benefit is enjoyed by her.
- The Student Mutual Help Fund is established for grant of stipends to the deserving students, the amount of which is fixed by the Principal.
- All concessions/ stipends will be tenable for one year and shall be renewed for the second year provided the attendance, academic performance and conduct of the student continues to be satisfactory.
- Application for fee concession/stipends should be forwarded on the prescribed form at the beginning of the academic session. The form should be countersigned by the parent/ guardian and duly verified by his/ her employer.

FEE FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS

The fee will be determined by the Ministry of Education.

Note: Any future changes in the fee/fund will be applicable as per government policy.

EXAMINATION

INTERNAL EVALUATION

The academic zenith of an institution is achieved by means of panoramic evaluation of its students. It is incumbent upon all students to take these examinations, failing which their admission forms will not be sent for the Federal Board / Quaid-e-Azam University Annual Examination. The following internal exams are conducted by the college.

- Class Tests
- Send Ups

Examinations conducted prior to forwarding admission forms to Board / University.

• Pre-Board / Pre-University

Examination conducted just before the Annual Examination.

• Detention Policy

Failure in three or more subjects in the Send up Examination will render a student ineligible for appearing in Federal Board Examination unless she passes a Re-test of the same subjects in the event that it is held in the college.

Note: Absence / Failure in these examinations will render a student ineligible for the Public Examination / Promotion.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Code of Conduct for Students

In order to maintain discipline, decorum and modesty among the students it is mandatory for them to:

- Attend the morning Assembly at 8:10 am daily.
- Attend all classes and practicals regularly.
- Attend and participate in co -curricular activities arranged in the college.
- Students are prohibited to:
- Stay in college premises after 3.30 pm as college administration will not be responsible for their security after the said time.
- Indulge in the use of unfair means or immoral practices inside the classrooms/laboratories and during the examinations.
- Indulge in damaging college property including building, equipment, plants and vehicles.
- Meet any outsider during college hours.
- Paste, exhibit, prepare or distribute any poster, leaflet, notice, pamphlet or handbill in the college.
- Participate in agitation or any subversive activities.

DISCIPLINE

Uniform

Students can only enter the college premises in complete uniform during the regular classes as well as at the time of receiving Roll no. slips from the college.

Science students are required to wear overalls during the practical exams.

Students are only allowed to wear simple black accessories.

Identity card (no id no entry)

The college ID card is an integral part of the uniform and it must be worn during college hours. Defaulters will be fined.

Bus card

Bus cards are issued after the submission of bus fee and are mandatory for boarding the bus.

Gadgets

Students are not allowed to bring any valuables including cell phones, jewellery, digital cameras or electronic gadgets.

If found the said items will be confiscated and will only be returned on the request of parents on payment of fine amounting to rupees 1000/-. In case this act is reiterated the students shall be fined Rs. 2,000/- and Rs. 3,000/- respectively.

Leave and absentee rules

- A student must have attended 80% of the total lectures delivered in each subject to appear in board/university examination, failing which her name will not be forwarded for the public examination.
- A student who remains absent from the class for fifteen days at a stretch in a month without any intimation will be automatically dropped from the college rolls.
- Two leaves per month will be granted in case any need arises.
- Students absenting themselves from any class/lecture, practical will be fined Rs. 5 per lecture.
- Students are required to attend the classes till the last formal date as announced by the college authorities.
- Fine will be imposed on self- preparation leaves before the exams.
- Fine up to Rs. 50 will be imposed by the college administration on the students absenting themselves from the college examination and for bunking the classes.

MEDICAL LEAVE

- In case of illness, medical leave of maximum 20 days, can be obtained after getting written approval from Principal/Vice Principal.
- Application for medical leave must be accompanied by a genuine medical certificate from a certified medical practitioner or government hospital.

CLEANLINESS

- The students are not allowed to bring eatables in the classrooms.
- The students are not supposed to leave the stuff related to cafeteria in its adjacent areas.
- If a student is caught throwing the trash outside the trash bins she will be punished and fined.
- If a student's involvement in the act of graffiti and wall chalking (writing obscene remarks on college property) is proved, she will be rusticated.

COLLEGE LEAVING

- A student willing to leave the college for good should submit an application duly signed by her parents 15 days prior to the date of intended departure.
- College leaving certificate will be granted after the student has cleared her dues and obtained clearance from the office and library.

CHANGE OF RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

The addresses and telephone numbers of students given in the admission forms should correspond to their actual addresses and telephone numbers where the college administration may contact the parents in case of emergency. Students providing incomplete/wrong information will be strictly dealt with.

Parents are advised to intimate college administration about any change in their addresses and telephone numbers immediately.

BS PROGRAMME

The BS Programme is designed to provide sufficient knowledge in core areas of Natural Sciences. The programme aims at providing students with the firm basis for taking higher studies in Computer Science, Mathematics and Zoology. The programme leading to BS shall be of four- year duration, equally divided into eight regular semesters. Each regular semester shall comprise of eighteen weeks, (sixteen weeks for teaching, and two weeks for the preparation and examination).

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAMME

The Associate Degree Programme is a two year post intermediate academic degree programme aimed to professionally equip the students with the local and international emerging trends.

Basic Eligibility

A candidate holding a Higher Secondary School Certificate, from a Pakistani Board or an equivalent certificate from any other recognised institution, with at least 45% marks is eligible for admission in ADP.


